In the academic year 2024–2025, STAND (Student's Training and Action for Neighbourhood Development) successfully conducted various programs, including orientation sessions, village workshops, and training awareness campaigns. Typewriting training for Shift I and II students in English and Tamil, summer and short-term training programs, government exam preparation with distinctions, Speed Typing Test, Christmas celebration with dress distribution& competitions, Financial support for economically weaker students

St. Vincent De Paul Typewriting Institute provides training for Shift I and Shift II college students, preparing them for government typewriting exams in English and Tamil. The institute offers regular practice, model exams, and hands-on training to enhance typing skills. In the 2024-2025 academic year, a one-month summer training program (6th May – 6th June) trained eight students, while a twoweek session (19th - 31st August) trained 40 students. From June to December, 305 students benefited from the program, with 63 appearing for the government exam and 32 achieving distinction. From January to June 2025, 125 students received training, and on 1st-2nd March 2025, 81 students took the government exam. A Speed Typing Test on 29th September 2024 commemorated St. Vincent De Paul's birth anniversary, with 40 students participating. On 16th December 2024, as part of Christmas celebrations, dresses were distributed to 37 deserving students, and various competitions were held.





The institute also provides financial support to economically weaker students by offering fee concessions and assistance with college fees, exam fees, and book purchases, upholding the values of compassion and community service.

Later, a Beautician Certificate Course was introduced on January 10, 2025, equipping women with professional skills. Several awareness programs were conducted, including talks on health and hygiene (August 6, 2024), women empowerment schemes (September 11, 2024), and women's education and empowerment (March 16, 2025).

The Centre also played an active role in social advocacy, organizing a human chain protest (August 21, 2024), a Climate Walkathon (October 27, 2024), and an International Human Rights Day event (December 10, 2024). Additionally, a paper presentation session (February 20, 2025) explored the portrayal of women in 21st-century literature and media. Faculty members enhanced their expertise by attending an Orientation Program on January 24, 2025. Through these activities, the Centre continued its mission to empower women through education, skill training, and social engagement.
