





Fig. 1.4 A simplified energy flow diagram depicting three trophic levels

Energy Flow in a Food Chain











Fig. 3.2. The Y-shaped energy flow model showing linkage between the grazing and detritus food chains




Figure #22: Simplified Food Web (Source Down) similar to Ozark Cool Water Low order Stream (or stream in heavy agriculture) example Dry Fork, Current Pre-Montauk Spring, etc. Largemouth is dominant top fish predator, though most common fish is the Stoneroller. Fillamentous algae and Detritus are base nutrients. Darters, Suckers, other Minnows are in lower concentrations. Green Sunfish is most common sunfish. Terrestrial Birds(Ospreys, Herons), Mammals (Humans, Otters, Raccons, Minks), and Reptiles (Turtles and Water Snakes) feed at all levels.
